3. NSA implemented a lengthy internal training program and mentoring program to develop FOIA officers. The mentoring program has
resulted in additional Senior Level Reviewers who assist with backlog reduction.
4. NSA already has very robust electronic processing and case tracking software. In addition, we were able to obtain dual monitors in Octobe
2007 for all of the FOIA reviewers so that they are able to more quickly and accurately process documents.

1. Standard job series for DOD FOIA personnel not established at NSA. NSA does not use the same job series as DOD. However, we have
standardized descriptions for FOIA officers within the NSA FOIA Office with standardized performance plans, objectives, and goals that
accurately reflect the responsibility and authority required of the FOIA function.
2. Have not participated in any DOD FOIA Officer Certification Program since it has not yet been established. However, have implemented
our own internal training program for initial certification, followed by a lengthy mentoring program.  3. Did not receive additional FOIA funding from DOD during FY07, or for FY08 yet. At beginning of FY08 received permission to hire
against an additional FOIA position and was able to bring in an individual with FOIA experience to augment the existing staff.

requesters to clarify requests rather than by letter.

The nine exemptions to the FOIA authorize federal agencies to withhold information covering: (1) classified national defense and foreign relations information; (2) internal agency rules and practices; (3) information that is prohibited from disclosure by another federal law; (4) trade secrets and other confidential business information; (5) inter-agency or intra-agency communications that are protected by legal privileges; (6) information involving matters of personal privacy; (7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, to the extent that the production of those records (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual; (8) information relating to the supervision of financial institutions; and (9) geological information on wells.
