

SUBJECT: Training of CBNRC Analysts at NSA

1. Reference is made to CANSLO 8-1/26 of 20 April 1961, Subject: Replacement for Mr. (presently integrated in ACOM). The National Security Agency is in agreement with the change in concept expressed in the reference. CB analysts will be welcomed in NSA to work on SIGINT problems of mutual interest and to take on-the-job training courses where possible. PL 86-36/50 USC 3605

2. Work on _____ would be an excellent beginning. It is suggested that a training period of about three months would be sufficient for _____ and this could be followed with some operational work if mutually agreeable.

3. A precise list of subjects to be covered and the amount of time to be spent on each would be difficult to establish at this time. It is believed that the next subject should be selected during the training period of the initial individual. CB might, however, find it useful to send someone for a rather extensive period on the 1401 prior to the receipt of the 1401 in Ottawa. Further, it might be useful to CB if, in addition to the range of subjects proposed, ______and analysis be considered.
