MEMORANDUM FOR THE MEMBERS OF USCIB:

Proposed Revision of USCIB Directive Number 5. Subject:

- 1. On 16 November 1954 the USCIB Security Committee submitted to the Executive Secretary a unanimously-agreed recommendation for amendment of USCIB Directive Number 5.
- This recommendation, which has been unanimously approved by USCIBEC, by vote sheet, would amend paragraph 1 of the Directive in question to read as follows:
 - "l. Provisions of this Directive are applicable to persons being considered for clearance and access to Category III and Category II COMINT. Minimum investigation and clearance standards for access to Category I COMINT will be in accordance with each USCIB member's existing clearance procedures for access to classified materials of the same classification. The elements of the procedure for clearing a person for Communications Intelligence (COMINT) are, consecutively:
 - Determination of the 'need to know'.
 - Investigation, and evaluation in terms of USCIB clearance standards.
 - c. Approval for indoctrination.
 - Indoctrination (and debriefing)."
- 3. The foregoing decision of USCIBEC is forwarded for USCIB consideration. In the absence of objection by any member prior to 1200, 14 December 1954, the decision will be considered approved.
