Subject: U.S. Synoptic Weather Forecasts, Request Concerning.

Reference: JIC Memorandum for Chairman, USCIB, dated 18 December 1952.

1. USCIB has approved the subject request and concurs in the procedure outlined in paragraph 4 of the referenced memorandum.

In connection with the basic request USCIB recommends that the [redacted] be informed that there is a Chinese shipping forecast transmitted by Shanghai which covers Chinese coastal waters and the South China Sea.
