known to Campaigne and has had relevant naval experience.)

H. J. Ryser, Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio

With the exception of Moise, the above were suggested by Albert because of their research being closely related to finite projective planes. I should hope that Albert might also be one of next summer's group. Saunders MacLane and Marshall Stone, both of the University of Chicago, may already have the necessary clearances and might be useful if they are willing.

Last summer I felt from the start that a few really good statisticians would be useful but they were not available at such short notice. I may wish to consult with Sam Wilks at Princeton concerning suitable personnel. I believe Wilks has the necessary clearances.
