2. CHIEF OF STLAFF
a. Announced that there would not be any of the intelligence perqoanel Iron the depertame involved in our conference on 12013 Noverber.
b. Added that there would be a cocictail party in the library at ABS immediately follosing the ccoference. Further details have been distributed to interested persons.
3. PRODCENTIG
a. Stated that there had been a reasrasgenent of the shoring in Wing 3, B Builaing, but that there vould have to be additionsl maintenance performei.
b. Made reference to his need for a typing pool to operate on whit would be probably an overtine basis, to relieve the operational back-log exiating within PROD. Stated that he vould contact Pais and COMP for the necessary arrangemente.
4. RESEABCH AID DEVELOPREATP
a. Cocsmented that Serial 3 of the AFSAM D806 has been received and is being tested prior to its release to the Bervices.
b. Reported that $R / D$ is testing sesapled of pareer tape (iapsegnated) for use in the cipber machines to eliminate the need for typewriter zibbon reuind machines. Stated that the tape had high potentialities, not the least among them wan it cheapnoss and its imediate arailability. (CoM interjected that he was faniliar oith this type paper and stated that because of the paper's high seasitivity it can only be usea in operations shich require the miniman of bandilng.)

## 5. GCIPTROLIER

a. Advised that a revier of the budget for FY-1955 by the SEcons had been poatiponed until next week which would allor more time in its preparation.
b. Ccesmented that the consolidation of management improvement reports received from the organizational elements for the last Fiscal Year clearly indicates points of difficulty which will bave to be resolved.

## 6. ADUUTAIFT GEMERAL

Reported that the problem of microfilming and retirement of materiala for PROD was presently under atudy. Comented that the dispoaition of saterials for retirement at Crane was greatly inproved over that at Alexandria. Stated further that it was considered advisable to place tape containers on top of cabinete which would make dramers available for storage of other saterials. Staff diviaica materials lend themselves most readily to wicrofilaing and would, therefore, make more hard-copy physical space available for PROD. Stated that facilities for microfilining should be eatablished in FROD by the Af, to expedite the exitire process.

## 7. COMABHCAMIONB

a. Advised that a meeting was held with the architecta and engineers at Fort Meade relative to their inquiries for location of ducts for the public address syatem to be installed in the new brillding.
b. Reported that the necessary axrangements have been made with Director, Comsunications-Electroaics, to provide cable compunication between MBA and CCHQ, to operate 14 hours a day, from 1800 hours to 0600 hours, beginning 3 Honeaber.

## 8. Covidichations securiry

a. Reported that a test circuit on the D806 was eatablished Monday froa Khulku, Hawail, for twenty minutes in plain language. At that time, the connection was lost and it was not picked up again by Cheltenham. KSA does not control the receivers, stated that R/D pleied up the aignal locally but was unable to use it because of the nolise level.
b. Commented that the problen of "expansion" of materials in white zotor ringe his been discussed with the manufacturers, and they will act uae the mane proceisiag methods with the ner 3001 nylon materials as apecified by Dupont.

b. Reported that the Attorney General's office informed us that the paper eliminating the RESTRICISD Classification went to the Prealdent last week for sigaature. However, he noted that the President would not sign it until he has had another meeting vith his cabinet.
c. At the conclusion of the discussion on the varying degrees of classification and their justification, the Director stated, "IF THET WANIS AM

## 28. HXLOMPAMIGE

a. Reviecred the unuaual operational activities cocurping in certain porticas of Eorea within the last three or four weekn involving special flights of aimeratt.
b. Stated that a briering of conowners was held last Friday, apporising them of these circuastancos, and noted that field units in this area have bean alertad for further developments. Comented in conciusion that conditions in the Fat East were unstable but that the significance of these abservations could not yot be deternined.
c. Hoted that a definite laxity existe in tranamismion of and prompt reporting of certain incidents which have occurred in the field.
d. Stated that rork was in proceas to design a standard cover sheet for all MBA publications (of a CCMIFI nature) distributed to consumers.
e. Reported that we are about to receive authorization from G-2 Army to make it posaible for all ISAA field stations and Army fiela atatioas to pess MSA production of Comint matetial to field comanders through the 8SO'm.
