1. I was at CROYDON Aerodrome today after a German air-raid:
 - A. The aerodrome's control buildings were demolished.
 - B. The main and repair hangars were demolished.
 - C. A large number of buildings were seriously damaged.
 - D. The main road along the aerodrome was closed, apparently because of the serious damage to war matériel located [1 group missed].
 - E. Many HURRICANES were dispersed round the aerodrome.
 - F. A large number of LEWIS guns are dispersed in the fields opposite the aerodrome. They were not there last week.
2. The press reports that CROYDON was bombed by about 30 aircraft at a height of 600 metres. There have been two air-raids/alerts again in LONDON today. Details [B% by letter].
