DICK'S VISIT TO KENLEY AIR STATION (1940)

To: MOSCOW

To JOHN [DELOW][1].

On 18th August the SAUSAGE-DEALERS [EULHASNIKI][ii] bombed RENLET Acredrone. I was there today. I could not get onto the aerodrone since all the roads are closed and guarded by soldiers. Soldiers and machine-gum nests are dispersed round the aerodrone in bushes and trenches [iii]. Fuel tanks are concealed in bushes. Hear the aerodrone there are bombed-out houses. A squadron of HURRICANES patrols in formation above the aerodrone the whole time in flights of three aircraft. Passers-by have their physicanthechodied. There was no panis among the population during an alert.
