  - [b] The sense of this sentence is not clear but it may mean that any surplus money is to be remitted to a reserve fund.
  - [c] No. 9499: Not available.
  - [d] The object i.e. what or whom is being sent, has been omitted.
- Comments:
- [i] CENTRE: GRU in MOSCOW.
  - [ii] SFETS: Contraction of the adjective SPETSIAL'NIY (Special) Usually the first element of a compound term. The meaning is not clear in this context but perhaps SPETSRAZVEDKA (Special Intelligence) is intended.
  - [iii] LVO: A known expansion is LENINGRAD Military District [LENINGRADSKIY VOENNIY OKRUG] but it is not clear whether this is applicable here.
  - [iv] MINK: Unidentified covername. Occurs as an addressee in MOSCOW's No. 347 of 5th May 1941 (3/NBF/T1538) and as a signature in STOCKHOLM's No. 770 of 29th July 1940 (3/NBF/T1537). Also occurs in STOCKHOLM's No. 1130 of 6th October 1941 (3/NBF/T1512).
  - [v] MIKHAIL: Unidentified covername. First occurrence.

- [vi] AKASTO: Col. N.I. NIKITUSHEV, Soviet Military and Air Attache in STOCKHOLM.
- [vii] SVENSON: Unidentified covername. Also occurs in MOSCOW's No. 373 of 14th May 1941 (3/NBF/T1613) and in STOCKHOLM's No. 3 of 3rd January 1941 (3/NBF/T1614), No. 737 of 19th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1888), No. 429 of 7th February 1943 (3/NBF/T1597) and No. 718 of 3rd March 1943 (3/NBF/T1615).
- [viii] MITRON: Also occurs in STOCKHOLM's No. 543 of 3rd September 1941 (unpublished), No. 1868 of 27th September 1941 (unpublished) and No. 1138 of 6th October 1941 (3/NBF/T1512). Covername MITRON occurs in NEW YORK's No. 1325 of 11th August 1943 (3/NBF/T668).
- [ix] HANERIA: Probably a coverword denoting a country.
