- Notes: [a] These two unrecovered gaps total 150 groups, but pending further recovery it is not clear at which point the first message ends.
- [b] The original makes it clear that information was given more than once.
- [c] This unrecovered number is likely to be 290.

- Comments: [i] K : Unidentified.
- [ii] AKASTO : Probably Col. N. I. NIKITUSHEV, Soviet Military Attaché in STOCKHOLM.
- [iii] TROITSKIJ : Not clear whether a cover-name or a real name. Possibly refers to NikolaJ TROITSKIJ, who was listed as chauffeur at the Soviet Legation in STOCKHOLM from 8th February 1941 until 25th December 1945. For previous occurrence see STOCKHOLM's No. 866 of 23rd August 1941 (3/NBF/T1 563).
