1. On 1st August VIKER had a meeting with [redacted] group unrecovered. He handed over a copy of a photograph of a new German invention

2. On 3rd August [redacted] 4-8 letters had a meeting with SERGEANT SERZHANT. He promised that he would be giving written material and would give a description of the design of the camera used in reconnaissance aircraft. SERGEANT reported the following :-
