- [ii] Simon BLIX-BERG: Simon Odd BLIX-BERG, Norwegian RIS courier between SWEDEN and NORWAY. He arrived in U.K. on 26th October 1942.
- [iii] ^λ ANDERSON: Unidentified covername. Also occurs in a number of messages between 24th March and 30th September 1942.
- As it has not been possible to recover "close brackets" immediately after ANDERSON the text should not be taken as evidence ANDERSON is BLIX-BERG's covername. The passage beginning with "open brackets" as a description of BLIX-BERG by ANDERSON has been interpolated in the main sentence.
- [iv] KIRKENES: NORWAY 69.44N 30.05E.
- [v] AKASTO: Col. N.I. NIKITUSHEV. Soviet Military Attaché in STOCKHOLM.
