Also occurs in STOCKHOLM's Nos. 303 of 17th February 1942 (3/NBF/T1603) and 737 of 19th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1808). The singular form NIL'SON occurs in STOCKHOLM's Nos. 304 of 17th February 1942 (3/NBF/T1833) and 393 of 27th February 1942 (3/NBF/T1802) and MOSCOW's Nos. 179 of 10th March 1942 (3/NBF/T1816) and 342 of 11th May 1942 (unpublished).

- [Cont'd]: [iii] GEGEL': ✕ i.e. "HEGEL"; unidentified covername. Also occurs in STOCKHOLM's Nos. 303 and 373 of 17th and 25th February 1942 (3/NBF/T1603 and 1548) and 737 of 19th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1808) and MOSCOW's No. 179 of 10th March 1942 (3/NBF/T1816).
- [iv] OSKAR: ✕ Unidentified. Also occurs in MOSCOW's No. 179 of 10th March 1942 (3/NBF/T1816) and STOCKHOLM's No. 737 of 19th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1808).
- [v] KOL'MORD: ✕ Unidentified. First occurrence.
- [vi] ADMIRAL: ✕ Probably Vladimir Aksen'evich STACHEVSKIJ, former Czarist Naval Attaché in STOCKHOLM.
- [vii] LITTLE OAK: ✓ Dead letter box.
- [viii] METRO: ✓ Any Soviet Embassy or Legation; in this instance possibly the Soviet Legation in STOCKHOLM.
- [ix] ARNOL'D: ✕ i.e. "ARNOLD"; presumably the covername of . MOSCOW previously asked STOCKHOLM to specify "which ARNOL'D" was meant (MOSCOW's No. 708 of 30th September 1942 (3/NBF/T1590)). ✓
- [x]
- [xi] MAURITs: ✕ i.e. "MAURITZ" or "MAURITS"; unidentified. Also occurs in MOSCOW's Nos. 765 of 11th October 1942 (unpublished) and 1018 of 25th December 1942 (unpublished) and STOCKHOLM's Nos. 3171 of 28th November 1943 (3/NBF/T1580) and 3283 of 7th December 1943 (3/NBF/T1581).
- [xii] ZAMDIREKTORA: i.e. "DEPUTY DIRECTOR", unidentified.
