- Comments: [i] AKASTO : Col. N. I. NIKITUSHV, Soviet Military Attaché in Stockholm.
- [ii] SAMUEL ✓: Unidentified cover-name. One other occurrence has been recovered, but without context, in MOSCOW's No.209 of 19th March 1942 - not published.
- [iii] ANDERSON : Unidentified. There is another occurrence in STOCKHOLM No. 1580 of 24th July 1942 (3/NBP/T1607).
- [iv] SVANTE : Unidentified cover-name. First occurrence. This is a Swedish male Christian name.
- [v] FELIX... : Unidentified. Possibly intended to be FELIX, a Swedish male Christian name, the Russian version of which would be transliterated as FELIKS. First occurrence.
