1. ANDERSON[ii]

His training has been completed and he is leaving [1 group unrecovered][b].

He has been taught the TALMUD[iii] (in accordance with telegram No. 2909[c]).  
The "SOUTH"[iv] signal plan [PROGRAMMA] has[d] been handed over [to him][e] and  
the MUSIC[v] has been taken from SAMUEL[vi].

The book is NORGE FORTELLER[f].

2. SVANTE[vii] and FRITZ[viii]

They left for NORWAY [1 group unrecovered][b]. They have been taught the TALMUD which we have[d] in reserve [in accordance with telegram No. 11023 of 1941[g] cipher [No.][e] 2). The SELIGER[ix] signal plan has been handed over [to them][e] and the MUSIC [1 group unrecovered] by us.

The book is QUISLING HAR SAGT.

3. FELIKS[x] and POL'KE[xi]

They have been taught the TALMUD which has been constructed by us on the same system[SKHEMA] as SVANTE's ([D% given in a] separate telegram). The TOSNO[xii] signal plan has been handed over [to them][e]: the MUSIC is not [3 groups unrecovered].

The book is "CHANSEN" by Barbra RING.

[C% 4.] SVANTE recommended for work in NORWAY his comrade Artur Ragnar SVENDSEN [SVENTSEN][xiii], born in 1921 in NORWAY (at FURNAS[FURNES]). SVENDSEN ("VAL'TER")[xiii] gave a written undertaking [that he would work][e] against the Germans in NORWAY. He is providing [2 groups unrecovered] with a MUSIC in KHBAR[xiv] or at another point according to our

[C% in order to] [1 group unrecovered] communications[SVYAZI][i] in NORWAY. [1 group unrecovered][h] I sent VAL'TER to NORWAY with the task of re-establishing communications[SVYAZI][i] and picking a MUSICIAN[MUZYKANT][xv]. He is to return by 1st June.

5. They[j] will send all communications in the Norwegian language.

6. Up to [1 group unrecovered][k] the sum of 12,000 Swedish kronor has been spent on the training and equipment of the above mentioned groups.

Also occurs in STOCKHOLM's No. 632 of 3rd April 1942 (not published) and No. 737 of 19th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1808) and in MOSCOW's No. 179 of 10th March 1942 (3/NBF/T1816), No. 209 of 19th March 1942 (3/NBF/T1717) and No. 710 of 30th September 1942 (3/NBF/T1608).

[vii] SVANTE: ✗

Robert HANSEN NYGAARD, a Norwegian RIS agent sentenced in SWEDEN in July 1942 for unlawful possession of a W/T set.

[viii] FRITS: ✗

i.e. "FRITS". Unidentified covername. Also occurs in STOCKHOLM's No. 836 of 2nd May 1942 (3/NBF/T1892). It is probable that MOSCOW refers to FRITS as FRED; see MOSCOW's No. 264 of 10th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1852) and No. 333 of 8th May 1942 (3/NBF/T1891).

Name of a lake in USSR. Unidentified coverword or covername. First occurrence.

[x] FELIKS: ✗

i.e. "FELIX"; Frank HEDMANN. See STOCKHOLM's No. 655 of 8th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1809).

The covername FELIKS also occurs in STOCKHOLM's No. 737 of 19th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1808) and No. 873 of 8th May 1942 (3/NBF/T1688) and in MOSCOW's No. 264 of 10th April 1942 (3/NBF/T1852), No. 343 of 11th May 1942 (not published) and No. 710 of 30th September 1942 (3/NBF/T1608).

[xi] FOLKE: ✗

i.e. "FOLKE"; unidentified covername. First occurrence.

Name of a town in USSR. Unidentified coverword or covername. First occurrence.

("VAL'TER") "VAL'TER" i.e. "WALTER", was a Norwegian  
agent arrested in SWEDEN on 16th May 1942.

as it decrypts but is obviously an  
encipherer's error, probably for HAMAR,  
with which is known to have  
been associated.
- [xv] MUSICIAN: ✓ Coverword for W/T operator.
- [xvi] AKASTO: ✓ Col. N.I. NIKITUSHEV, Soviet Military and  
Air Attaché in STOCKHOLM.
