With reference to your No. [1 group unrecovered][a] I report:

1. FELIX's [FELIX][ii] cipher (on ALBIN's [AL'BIN][iii] principle).

The primary encrypted text is in Swedish using 26 letters and two punctuation marks. The eight monome letters are ADINCRST. The key starts at the third letter of the word used for generating the number allocator [CRISLOVOJ RASPRJELITEL'][b]; continue by taking the digits [c] from right to left and from bottom to top, line by line.

The first indicator is added to the third group from the beginning multiplied by three[d]. We put it at the third position from the beginning. The second indicator is added to the fourth group from the end multiplied by four[d]. We put it at the fourth position from the end. The service group[e]
