REQUEST THAT ABRAM SHOULD BE LEFT IN STOCKHOLM (1943)

In answer to No. 5338[a].

ABRAM[ii] is the most highly qualified man[RABOTNIK] here and his departure would put the RESIDENCY in a difficult position. He is actually [1 group unrecovered] but [BA the Swedes] surely take it "[BA for granted]" that, apart from "the MISTRESS[KhOZYaJKA]"[iii], everyone is carrying out "[BA agent[ABETURNYJ]] work" and they keep everyone under all-round surveillance. In the past week, for instance, surveillance of ANATOLIJ[iv] has been maintoined but it was discontinued in the case of ABRAM. ARCAN would prove his worth if he were in charge of [RUEDVODITEL\*] a group or of work with legitimate contacts[LEGAL\*NYS SYTAZI]. Later on several [1 group unrecovered] contacts[SYTAZI] might be handed over to him. At present he is in contact with [SYYAZAN S] two agents[b] and is carrying out the development [RAZEABOTKA][c] of several persons. It is very [BV important] that ABRAM should be left here.
