- [vii] CHERNYJ: i.e. BLACK, Thomas L. BLACK.
- [viii] PANASENKO: Presumably Ivan Abramovich PANASENKO.
- [ix] MAJ: i.e. MAY, Stepan Zakharovich APRESYAN, Soviet Vice-Consul in NEW YORK.
