"CHARON" COMPLAINS OF THE CONDUCT OF A
NEIGHBOUR'S WORKER, MOLCHANOV (1944)

To VIKTOR. [i]

Boris MOLCHANOV, [ii] who works for the NEIGHBOURS [iii] in LOS ANGELES, did not turn up for night duty.

[15 groups unrecovered]

[C% MOLCHANOV] [4 groups unrecovered]. Taking into account the fact that in connection with the PILIPENKO [iv] affair there is a possibility of intensified shadowing [4 groups unrecovered] [C% for his part] MOLCHANOV [1 group unrecovered] [C% that he] "did not wish to [6 groups unrecovered]" [it is] [a] necessary to warn the NEIGHBOURS about the childish conduct of their workers.

[ii] MOLCHANOV : There was a Soviet Government official in the Vice-Consulate in LOS ANGELES by the name of Boris Stepanovich MOLCHANOV.
[iii] NEIGHBOURS : Members of another Soviet Intelligence organization.
[iv] PILIPENKO : Ivan Il'ich PILIPENKO, 1st Assistant Vice-Consul at the Soviet Consulate, LOS ANGELES. Reported to have been contacted by KHEJNETs ("KHARON") each time the latter visited LOS ANGELES.
