BROTHER-IN-LAW'S CONNECTIONS WITH THE MILITARY NEIGHBOURS
AND WITH THE SWEDS (1944)

To VIKTOR[i].

Reference your No. 296[a].

BROTHER-IN-LAW [ZYaT'] [ii] has already been working with the Military Neighbours [iii] for several years; he is in contact with NIKITIN [iv]. I have noticed [that] [b] the Swedes plant [PODSTAVLYaYat'] BROTHER-IN-LAW on us at every convenient opportunity. Relations with BROTHER-IN-LAW have not been fully regularized on an agent network basis and probably BROTHER-IN-LAW is reporting to the Swedes on meetings with NIKITIN. We think that it is not expedient for us to carry out any further investigation of BROTHER-IN-LAW.

Comments: [i] VEKTOB : Lt. Gen. P.N. FITIN.
[ii] BROTHER-IN-LAW : Unidentified cover-name. No other occurrence has yet been recovered.
[iii] Military Neighbors: Soviet Military Intelligence (GRU).
[iv] NIKITIN : Unidentified. This could be a cover-name or a real name. There was a Mikhail NIKITIN in STOCKHOLM at this time who was chief of the Commercial Representation.
[v] VALERIAN : Vasilij Fedorovich RUDIN, 1st Secretary at the Soviet Legation in STOCKHOLM.
