IN THE NAVAL NEIGHBOUR'S UNIT

To VIKTOR. [1]

With the diplomatic mail despatched from STOCKHOLM on 3rd November 1944, the Naval NEIGHBOUR [SOSID] [11] and seven members of his staff in violation of Government regulations [8 groups unrecovered] to their relatives and friends

[22 groups unrecovered]

and dues of somebody in the group amounting to hundreds of crowns

[9 groups unrecoverable]

[1 group unrecovered] by us facts [a] of the moral corruption of the Naval NEIGHBOUR'S unit [KOLLEKTIV], would consider it advisable [G] to open the Naval NEIGHBOUR'S diplomatic mail at the People's Commissariat of Foreign Affairs [NKVD] in the presence of a representative of [D] the Party's Control and call those guilty to account [G] before the party. [1 group missing].
