PROPOSED REORGANISATION TO BRING IN AN EXTRA CADRE WORKER:
"TEKNIK", "FED", "KLOD", "T.N.Y.C."
(1945)

To VIKTOR[i].

In view of the [C% favourable] outlook for the development of our work here, I submit for your decision the question of sending a cadre worker to take up a permanent post as deputy head of the T.A.S.S office[OTDELENIE] in SYDNEY. If this measure were to be put into effect, it would permit us to exercise increased control of "KLOD's"[ii] [D% groups] and thereafter substantially [B% to lighten his load]. At one and the same time it would provide an opportunity for consolidating both the line indicated above and our work (Department of External Affairs [MID], intelligence services, political parties and so on) by having an appropriate agent net[AGENTUR.] for each of these in the two principal cities of AUSTRALIA - SYDNEY and MELBOURNE. [1 group unrecovered] the recruitment of such a worker will

be especially favourable to the prosecution of our work. Such an opportunity must be taken advantage of, as there is not a single post in the Legation in CANBERRA which would produce such results. In the event of the appointment of a new worker exceeding the establishment of our office, I should think that using "TEKHNIK"[iii] would enable one of the lines of work mentioned by us to be brought under control. In the event of the appointment of a new worker exceeding the establishment of our office[a], I should consider it expedient to engineer "FED's"[iv] posting away from here. It is possible that he could be of greater use on other work. [C^o as you know] "TANYa"[v] is working on full pay

to use her in our line of work does not seem possible. "FED" is deeply offended by the fact that, having graduated from the Institute, he has to work as a courier of the Special Guard[SPETSOKhrAN.]. However, up to now ^{it} has not been possible to ^{do any} any serious work on instructing Soviet citizens or on collecting and processing overt[LEGAL'NYJ] information. Translation is likewise sluggish
