J.V. PLUMB[i], the authorized representative of the Government, was appointed to accompany them. The Government informed MCUNTENTEN of its decision and asked him to cooperate and, in particular, not to employ repressive measures against the Indonesians, since this could lead to internal complications in AUSTRALIA. In his ricly M.[ii] referred to heavy losses and internal disturbances in JAVA and said that all this made it impossible to carry out the Australian Government's decision. On 13rd October CHIFLEY communicated the following to MCUNTEATTEN: "The Indonesian will be langed in the ports of their choice, i.e. in SURABAYA or MEDAN." On 13rd October M. informed LONDON of this and declared that he would take no

responsibility for landing the Indonesians under emisting conditions and asked for instructions. In a telegram dated 23rd October CHIPLEY sent .TPLEE an explanation, stating that M. attrached two much significance to the moods of the Dutch, who were ready to suspect any political opponent of being an "extremist", and that the arrival of 140 Indonesians would harrily give great has stance to the extremists in their struggle for an independent republic. Further CHIPLEY [28 pointed out that] to abandon the Indonesians, as M. proposed, was impossible, as this would arouse serious maxiety in AUSTPALUS. [C% "]
