DISCUSSION WITH CRAWFORD ON MEMBERS
OF AUSTRALIAN LABOUR GOVERNMENT (1945)

To VIKTOR. [i] 3th Department.

In a conversation with me John CRAWFORD - head of the Research Department of the Ministry of Post-War Reconstruction (his brother was first secretary in the Australian Legation in the USSR), while on the subject of CHIPLEY, who filled the place of leader of the Labour Party and Prime-Minister after CURTIN's death, said that the latter stood between the centre and the left wing of the party and was more progressive than CURTIN. After CURTIN CHIPLEY was [B% the most] suitable [B% candidate] for the transitional period from war to peace. In C's [K.] opinion CHIPLEY has a number of qualities which make him outstanding among Labour people: a clear mind, furthermore strength of will, also [5 groups unrecovered] boldness and decisiveness in carrying out measures in hand.
