SMIRNOVA[11] and her husband left SAN FRANCISCO for VLADIVOSTOK on board the ship "NOVOSIBIRSK" on 28th February 1945.

Reference [C% number ] 62.

GLASKO[111] and family left PORTLAND for VLADIVOSTOK on the ship "KAMENETS-PODOL'SK" on 28th February 1945. After his embarkation on the ship the immigration authorities demanded his disembarkation. We shall report details later.

To frequent reminders to PETR[iv] to organize a trip to PORTLAND he pleads an impossibility in view of his unfortunate cover. The leaders[RUKOVODSTVO] advised you that PETR was determined to go to SEATTLE for a meeting with "SERGEJ"[v]. Having gone there PETR can organize [1 group unrecovered] meeting with VOVChEK[vi] or VITALIJ[vii] or [2 groups unrecovered] from SEATTLE to PORTLAND. [C% Please] telegraph permission to PETR to organize a trip immediately. All your instructions to VITALIJ, VOVChEK after "DAR's"[viii] departure were not handed over, likewise the list of the ship agent network was not handed over to them.

- [ii] SMIRNOVA: Nina Stepanovna SMIRNOVA, who was being sent home from AUSTRALIA after an alleged attempt to escape and remain in AUSTRALIA. Her husband was Anatolij Nikolaevich SMIRNOV, an accountant at the Soviet Embassy in CANBERRA.
- [iii] GLASKO: Dmitrij Adamovich GLASKO, Port Captain, PORTLAND, ORE.
- [iv] PETR: Aleksandr Petrovich GRACHEV.
- [v] SERGEJ: Viktor Vasil'evich AFANAS'EV.
- [vi] VOVChEK: Aleksandr Pavlovich BOChEK.
- [vii] VITALIJ: Pavel Kuz'mich REVIZOROV.
- [viii] DAR: i.e. "GIFT," Grigorij Pavlovich KASPAROV.
