DUHIG[viii], QUEENSLAND chairman[c], he is a professor of pathology there at [d], progressive.

D.O. GRAY[ix] - lecturer in bacteriology at the University of Q.[KV.][xi], progressive.

M. MITCHELL[xi], SOUTH AUSTRALIA representative[e], lecturer in biochemistry at the University of ADELAIDE, undesirable type.
