From the sources an attempt is being made to obtain confirmation [5 groups unrecovered] that conditions in the confederation[ii] are becoming less favourable for legal activity by the "FRATERNAL[BRATSKAYA]" [iii]. Following speeches by members of Parliament against the leaders[UKOVODITELI] of the "FRATERNAL", it must be expected that there will be increased sur [iv] of members

reconsider the abilities of his officers[RABOTNIKI]. Instruct "TECHNICIAN [TEKHNIK]" [iv] to consider this question with "CLAUDE[KLUD]" [v] himself and submit to us for approval your proposals for organizing the work with him. At the same time state what opportunities "CLAUDE" has for stepping up [his][a] work for us and for [arranging][a] trips[VYKHODY][b] to the ISLAND [OSTROV][vi] under conditions of complete safety from compromise[PROVAL][c].
