

THE FOLLOWING NORTHWARD PERSONNEL MOVEMENTS WERE REIPRTED BY T-9 OF BT 14, 25 MARCH, DISPATCHED -- 15 DESERTERS REMAINING -- 6 PERSONNEL CONSISTING OF 3 CHILDREN, 2 SICK AND WOUNDED AND 1 UNIDENTIFIED TYPE 26 MARCH, RECEIVED -- 11 PERSONNEL, CONSISTING OF 7 SICK AND WOUNDED, 3 CHILDREN AND ONE STRTCHER CASE DISPATCHED -- 10 PERSONNEL, CONSISTING OF 4 SICK AND WOUNDED; 3 BLIND; 2 CHILDREN AND WOMAN C. GENERAL A FURTHER REFERENCE TO \$278,\$ AN UNIDENTIFIED ELEMENT, WAS CONTAINED IN A 24 MARCH REPORT FROM THE LAGTIAN PANHANDLE. THE HIGHLY FRAGMENTED REPORT MENTIONED VEHICLES WITH SPECIAL WEAPONS WHICH BELONG TO GROUP #12 OF 27#.\$ THE REPORT FURTHER STATED THAT SNUMBER 176 IS CARRYING SPECIAL WEAPONS OF 278. ON 8 MARCH, BT 35 REPORTED THAT SA FORCE OF 278 WAS GDING ON FOOT, SALONG WITH 461\$ TO THE GROUP 471 AREA (DGDRSS NR. 75, 15 MARCH). THE IDENTITY OF Ø12 AND 27Ø CANNOT BE DETERMINED AT THIS TIME; HOWEVER, GROUP 461 IS A PROBABLE ELEMENT OF THE NVA 2D DIVISION. III. GENERAL DEVELOPMENTS -- LAOS A. THE ASSISTANT POLITICAL OFFICER OF THE 16TH AAA BATTALION PASSED INFORMATION ABOUT THE SHOOTDOWN OF A C-13Ø IN A 29 MARCH REPORT TO BT 32. THE AIRCRAFT HAD BEEN REPORTEDLY DOWNED AT THE 591ST AAA REGIMENT'S OLD VEHICLE PARK AT KI; HOWEVER, THE 16TH BATTALION DEFICER WAS NOT SURE THAT THIS WAS CORRECT. THE AIR- CRAFT DEBRIS WAS SCATTERED OVER A DNE-ACRE AREA, AND ONLY THE TAILPIECE, TWO METERS BY ONE METER, REMAINED INTACT. THE REMAINDER WAS IN BURNED FRAGMENTS. AN INSIGNIA WAS PICKED UP, BEARING THE FOLLOWING LEGEND, MOB ORO LALI LE FIL CFFR (1AA3) OBAR PNØØ1 NØØ1 PØ8159 CØØ1 FFFR1 APR RØ 9499Ø 33B855 TØØ2 PAN 115 VØR CG 499Ø 33PØ 85 169ØØ3. THE 16TH BATTALION SENT TWO TEAMS TO SEARCH FOR THE SPOT WHERE THE AIRCRAFT WENT DOWN, AND THE BATTALION STAFF OFFICER PROMISED TO REPORT TO BT 32 WHEN THE LOCATION HAD BEEN DETERMINED AND PLOTTED. ACCORDING TO COLLATERAL INFORMATION, AN AMERICAN CLOS AIR- CRAFT WAS DOWNED BY PROBABLY A SAM IN AN AREA SOUTH OF TCHEPONE. THE ESCORT AIRCRAFT REPORTED THAT ALL CREWMEMBERS HAD BEEN KILLED WHEN A PROBABLE SAM PENETRATED THE FUSELAGE AND IGNITED THE AMMUNITION ON BOARD. (2 ZVCJ/T488-72, 298918Z) B. BINH TRAM 45 DISCUSSED FOOD AND MEDICAL SUPPLY SHORTAGES IN A 27 MARCH CONVERSATION WITH GROUP 472. THE BINH TRAM REPORTED THAT THE FOODSTUFF SITUATION WAS EXTREMELY CRITICAL, WARRANTING THE DECLARATION OF A LEVEL 1 ALERT. THE STORAGE AREA WAS OUT OF MEAT AND OTHER FOODSTUFFS, AND NEARLY OUT OF COOKING OIL. THE 52D TRANSPORTATION BATTALION HAD BEEN DRAWING GOODS FROM THE STORAGE AREA, SINCE THEY HAD ALREADY EXCEEDED THE TOTAL THEY WERE PERMITTED TO DRAW FROM BT 32 DURING MARCH. THE LEVEL 1 ALERT ALSO APPLIED TO MEDICAL SUPPLIES, ALTHOUGH THE SITUATION DID NOT APPEAR TO BE
