ONE OF THESE MAS IMPACTED AT 1841H 10544E, WHILE THEOTHER PR HABLY EQUATES TO THE SAM SITE AT 1842N 18542E. IN A POST LAUNCH REPORT, FROM 8612 TO 8625Z, DRV MULTICHANNELCOMMUNICATIONS CONFIRMED THE LAUNCH OF ONE MISSILE, BY A SAMSITE AT 1842N 10542E, WHEN A SPEAKER AT THE SAM SITE REPORTED TO HIS REGIMENTAL CONTROLLER THAT, "ALTITUDE WAS IN METERS, WE FIRED FIRST ONE AND THAT WAS ALL". THE TIME FOR THE MISSILE LAUNCHAND OTHER LAUNCH DATA WERE NOT REPORTED. OPERATIONAL REPORTS INDICATE THAT A TOTAL OF SEVEN MISSILES WERE OBSERVED BY U.S. PILOTS ON 14 SEPTEMBER. THREE OF THESEMISSILES WERE SIGHTED BETWEEN \$457 AND \$458Z, IN THE VICINITY OF 1845N 18552E, WITH ONE OF THE MISSILES DESTROONG A NAVY ALL ALGCRAFT. THESE MISSILE SIGHTINGS AND THE SUBSEQUENT SHOOTDONNEQUATE WITH THE MISSILE LAUNCHES REFLECTED IN ELINT AND POSSIBLY TO THE MISSILE LAUNCH REFLECTED IN DRY MULTICHANNEL COMMUNICATIONS. SIGINT DID NOT REFLECT THE OTHER FOUR MISSILES J WHICH WERE OBSERVED IN -+(8:89#Ø6 9: 21Ø6N 1Ø7Ø5E AT APPROXIMATELY Ø9Ø5Z. THE LAST U.S AIRCRAFT LOSS TO A DRV MISSILE LAUNCH HAS ON 27 AUGUST. SECTION THO - POSSIBLE DRV MIG REACTION TO U.S. AIRCRAFT NEST OF HANDI. ON 14 SEPTEMBER, DRV AIR SURVEILLANCE FACILITIES REFLECTED TWO PHAC YEN BASED MIG'S IN A POSSIBLE REACTION TO THO HOSTILE AIRCRAFT, APPROXIMATELY 50 NAUTICAL MILES WEST OF HANOI. BETWEEN \$944 AND \$127Z, DRY AIR SURVEILLANCE FACILITIESREFLECTED A HOSTILE TRACK, IDENTIFIED AS TWO AIRCRAFT, ENTERING THE DRY FROM LAOS AND FLYING EASTE TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 35 NAUTICAL MILES SOKTHEAST OF HANDI AT 1005Z: THE™HOSTILE FLIGHT THEN FLEW NORTH NORTHWEST TO≪A POSITION 40 NAUTICAL MILES NORTH OF HANOI AT 1008Z. THEN TURNED WEST FOR THO MINUTES AND AT 1010Z THE HOSTILE TRACK TOOK A SOUTHWESTERLY HEADING AND WAS LAST NOTED OVER LAGS AT 2006N 10330E. THE TWO PHUC YEN DASED MIG'S, WHICH WERE IN POSSIBLE REACTION, HERE FIRST REFLECTED ON DRV AIR SURVEILLANCE FACILITIES AT 1002Z, SIX NAUTICAL MILES NORTHEAST OF HANOI. THE MIG'S THEN FLEW SOUTH TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY 15 NAUTICALHQILES SOUTH OF HANOI AND THEN WESTERLY. FROM 1815 TO 1816Z, THE MIG-AND HOSTILE TRACKS FLEW A PARALLEL COURSE, ON A SOUTHWESTERLY HEADING, APPROXIMATELY 50 NAUTICAL MILES WEST OF HANDI: THE CLOSEST APPROACH OF THE MIG'S TO THE HOSTILE FLIGHT OCCURRED AT 1015Z, WHEN THE TWO TRACKS WERE APPROXIMATELY 12 NAUTICAL MILES APART. 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AIRCRAFT EAST OF HANOI ON THE MORNING OF 14 SEPTEMBER. FROM \$218 5TO \$31\$Z, DRV AIR SURVEILLANCE AND TACTICAL VOICE FACILITIES REFLECTED A MINIMUM OF 14 MIG'S, AT LEAST FOUR OF WHICHNERE MIG-21'S, IN REACTION TO 12 HOSTILE AIRCRAFT APPROXIMATELY 35 NAUTICAL MILES EAST OF HANOI, THO OF WHICH SUBSEQUENTLY RESULTED IN AIR ENGAGEMENTS. DRV AIR SURVEILLANCE FACILITIES INITIALLY REFLECTED THE HOSTILE AIRCRAFT AT THREE DIFFERENT POINTS: THE FIRST FLIGHT38 NAUTICAL MILES NORTHEAST OF HAIPHONG AT \$218Z; THE SECONDFLIGHT APPROXIMATELY 33 NAUTICAL MILES EAST OF HAIPHONG AT \$229Z. FROM \$225 TO \$31\$Z, DRV TACTICAL VOICE FACILITIES REFLECTED FOUR MIG-21'S, STAGING FOM PHUC YEN, ON A DEFENSIVE PAT QL'IN REACTION TO ALLIGHT OF 2/4 LEC LE AIGCRAFT.(;, WHICPCWERE APPROXIMATELY 39 NAUTICAL MILES EAST OF HANOI. THIS PATROL CONSISTED OF TWO FORMATIONS, OF TWO AIRCRAFT EACH, WITH ONE FORMATION FLYING 28\$\$ FEET HIGHQER THAN THE OTHER DURING AT LEAST A PORTION OF THE PATROL.
