ON 17 AUGUST NVAF MIGS, AS REFLECTED BY NVN AIR SURVEILLANCE, AIR OPERATIONS, AND TACTICAL AIR FACILI- TIES, ONCE AGAIN UTILIZED THE FORWARD STAGING BASE AT BAI THUONG (NOT USED FOR THE PURPOSE SINCE A MIG-21 WAS DOWNED ON Ø1 AUGUST: SEE USA-32 SPOT REPORT 2/H3/VCK/R311-68, DTG: Ø1Ø417Z AND FOLLOW-UPS) FOR COMBAT OPER-, ATIONS AGAINST U.S. STRIKE AIRCRAFT IN THE VINH AREA. THE TWO PERIODS OF VINH AREA ACTIVITY INVOLVING A FORCE OF FOUR MIG-17'S AND TWO MIG-21'S THAT DEPLOYED TO THE STAGING BASE THE PREVIOUS DAY (SEE USA-32 SPOT REPORT 2/43/VCK/R338-68, DTG: 16/8882 AUG 68) COMBINED WITH THE MORE RECENTLY DEPLOYED (Ø1 HOUR ON 17 AUGUST) FORCE OF AT LEAST TWO MIG-21'S, WERE CLIMAXED BY THE DESTRUCTION OF A U.S. NAVY F4B. BEGINNING AT Ø45, AIR OPERATIONS MESSAGED BETWEEN HANDI BAC MAI AND BAI THUONG INDICATED AT LEAST TWO, POSSIBLY FOUR MIG-21'S WERE TO DEPLOY TO BAI THUONG. THESE MESSAGES INDICATED A TOTAL OF FOUR, POSSIBLY SIX MIG-21 AIRCRAFT WOULD BE AT BAI THUONG DURING THE DAY. TWO OF THE MIGS WERE INITIALLY REFLECTED BY AIR SURVEILLANCE FACILITIES FROM THE HANDI AREA TO BAI THUONG AIRFIELD AT Ø112 AND LANDED SUBSEQUENT TO Ø135. AS EARLY AS Ø226 THE BAI THUONG MIGS WERE PLACED ON CONDITION TWO AND WERE LATER TO BE PLACED ON CONDITION ONE AT Ø3Ø4. AT Ø312, VINH INFORMED BAI THUONG THAT THE MIG-21'S WERE TO TAKE OFF AT Ø314 AND A MESSAGE IN THE NEXT MINUTE POSSIBLY REPORTED THAT MIG-17'S TOOK OFF AT Ø31Ø. NVN AIR SURVEILLANCE FACILITIES REFLECTED FLIGHTS OFTWO (PROBABLE MIG-21) AND FOUR (PROBABLE MIG-17) AIRCRAFT WERE SUBSEQUENTLY REFLECTED IN AN AREA SOUTHWEST OF BAI THUONG. THE CLOSEST NOTED APPROACH TO HOSTILE AIRCRAFT DURING THIS ACTIVITY WAS 20 NM AT: 0324 WHEN THE MIGS WERE LOCATED AT 19-40N/105-22E. THE FIGHTERS SUBSEQUENTLY RETURNED TO BAI THUONG, WHERE THE MIG-17'S LANDED AT 0345, FOLLOWED BY THE MIG-21'S AT 0348. THE SECOND PERIOD OF MIG ACTIVITY BEGAN AT 0901 WHEN TWO MIG-21'S WERE NOTED FLYING SOUTH FROM BAI THUONG, AND FOUR MINUTES LATER THE BAI THUONG GCI RADAR WAS ACTIVATED. THE INTERCEPTORS PROCEEDED TO AN AREA WEST OF VINH AND, RECEIVING VECTORING INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE VINH CONTROLLER BEGINNING AT 0910. APPROACHED WITHIN A REPORTED 3.8 NM OF THE HOSTILES, IDENTIFIED AS TWO "F-4'S". LATER, AT 0923, THE FLIGHT LEADER REPORTED THAT HE HAD FIRED ONE MISSILE AND CLAIMED TO HAVE DESTROYED AN F-4. AT THIS TIME, AND UNIDENTIFIED CONTROLLER REPORTED TO VINH THAT TWO (PILOTS) HAD PARACHUTED. THE MIGS SUBSEQUENTLY
REVERSED COURSE AND RETURNED TO BAI THUONG, LANDING THERE BY 0931. DURING THE
TIME FRAME OF THE ENGAGEMENT IN THE VINH AREA, TWO ADDITIONAL MIG-21'S AND
"PROBABLY FOUR MIG-17'S WERE REFLECTED AIRBORNE FROM BAI THUONG IN AN APPARENT

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DEFENSIVE PATROL PRODABLY IN PROTECTION OF THE MIG-21'S THAT WOULD BE RETURNING TO BAI THUONG FROM THE VINH AREA. THESE MIGS ORDITED IN AN AREA SOUTHWEST OF BAI THUONG AND RETURNED TO THE SOUTHERN STAGING BASE BY 1888. SRO- 2 IFF RADAR EMISSIONS, INDICATIVE OF MIG-17 AIRCRAFT, WERE DETECTED BETWEEN Ø913 AND Ø948. BETWEEN Ø918 AND Ø938, JAMMING OF VHF COMMUNICATIONS WAS CONDUCTED BY U.S. FORCES, AS REFLECTED IN NVAF TACTICAL AIR COMMUNI- CATIONS. IN THE FINAL PERIOD OF ACTIVITY, DURING THE LATE 18 AND EARLY 11 HOURS, NVAF TACTICAL AIR AND AIR SUR- VEILLANCE FACILITIES REFLECTED THE RETURN FLIGHT OF FOUR MIG-17'S AND FOUR MIG-21'S FROM BAI THUONG TO PHUC YEN. COMMENTS: OPERATIONAL DATA REVEALS THAT DAKOTA FLIGHT (TWO U.S. NAVY F-4'S) RECEIVED A MIG WARNING WHILE RE- TURNING FROM A STRIKE MISSION IN THE VINH AREA. IN AN ATTEMPT TO INTERCEPT THE MIGS, DAKOTA 288 APPARENTLY OVERSHOT ONE OF THE MIGS AND EXECUTED A RIGHT TURN, SIMULTANEOUSLY RECEIVING A SECOND MIG WARNING. DAKOTA 281 THEN SIGHTED WHAT HE BELIEED WAS A MIG, BUT WAS IN REALITY DAKOTA 286 WHO, DESPITE EVASIVE MANUEVERS, WAS OBSERVED HIT BY AT LEAST TWO DE THE MISSILES: AND WAS LATER SEEN WITH HIS LEFT ENGINE AFLAME. REFERENCE FOLLOW-UP NUMBER ONE THIS SERIES: DELETE ALL REFERENCES TO "FEINT/DIVERSION". THE ACTUAL MEANING/USAGE OF THIS VIETNAMESE WORD IS UNKNOWN AT THIS TIME. XXHH 888 NNNN

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
