ASSISTANCE FROM THE BINH TRAM IN ORDER TO REPAIR THESE VEHICLES. GROUP 2228B WAS INITIALLY OBSERVED IN A 12 JANUARY DISPATCH FROM BT 33 WHICH ALSO REFERENCED THE VEHICLES OF THE GROUP, AND NEITHER THE STRENGTH NOR DISPOSITION WERE REVEALED. (DGRSS NR. 16, 16 JANUARY; AND 21 [VCJ/T230-71, 140020Z] 2. FURTHER REFERENCE TO GROUPS 3069, 3070, AND 22090 WERE NOTED IN MESSAGES OF 14, 15 AND 16 JANUARY FROM VARIOUS ENTITIES IN THE BT 35 AREA. 7 .+4970 3069 HAD BAE RECEIVED AT PROBABLY T-61 FROM T-60 ON 14 JANUARY. THIS GROUP HAD A TROOP STRENGTH OF 526 PERSONNEL, PLUS 29 PERSONS TRAVELING SEPARATELY. A 16 JANUARY MESSAGE SUGGESTED THAT PROBABLY THIS GROUP HAD BEEN DISPATCHED TO T-62 ON THAT DATE. GROUP 3069 WAS NOTED IN THE BT 14 AREA ON 22 DECEMBER WITH A COMPLEMENT OF 543 PERSONNEL. (DGRSS NR. 358, 24 DECEMBER) A 15 JANUARY DISPATCH FROM T-61 INDICATED THAT GROUP 3070 HAD BEEN RECEIVED FROM T-60 ON THE PRECEDING DAY. THIS GROUP WAS LED BY COMMANDER VI YEN (VI YEEN) AND HAD A COMPLEMENT OF 499 PERSONNEL. GROUP 3070 WAS LAST OBSERVED IN THE BT 26 AREA ON 11 DECEMBER WITH A STRENGTH OF 517 PERSONNEL. (DGRSS NR. 348, 14 DECEMBER) ACCORDING TO A 14 JANUARY COMMUNIQUE FROM THE 12TH COMMO-LIAISON BATTALION, GROUP 22090 HAD BEEN DISPATCHED TO PROBABLY T-62 ON THE MORNING OF THE 14TH. ANOTHER MESSAGE OF THE SAME DATE, FROM THE 12TH STET BATTALION/T-62, STATED THAT THIS GROUP HAD BEEN RECEIVED FROM T-61, AND WAS COMPRISED OF 11 PERSONS WITH FIVE RUCKSACKS. THE GROUP WAS NOTED AT T-61 ON THE 13TH, AND AT THAT TIME IT WAS BELIEVED THAT 5 OF THE 11 PERSONNEL WERE ON A HIGH FOOD STANDARD. (DGRSS NR. 14, 14 JANUARY).
