DAILY GENERAL DIRECTORATE OF REAR SERVICES SUMMARY NUMBER 131, 11 MAY 1971 XXCC DESPITE THE DAMAGE AND CASUALTIES IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE 2D COMPANY AND ITS THREE WEAPONS WOULD DEPLOY ALONG ROUTE 16A WHILE THE 1ST AND 4TH COMPANIES, ALONG WITH THE BATTALION HEADQUARTERS WERE TO GO TO HUOI XAN (YD 6436, 16-35N 106-33E). THE DEPLOYMENT OF GDRS AAA ELEMENTS THIS FAR EAST ALONG ROUTE 9 IS UNUSUAL. (2/F1/T3280-71, 091229Z) 3. WEAPONS POSITIONS FOR THE 12TH AAA BATTALION, 593D AAA REGIMENT WERE DISCLOSED IN A 6 MAY DISPATCH. IT WAS NOTED THAT THE 1ST COMPANY HAD GUN POSITIONS AT KMS 30.5 AND 21 \$ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF ROUTE 35A. \$ THE 2D COMPANY HAD SET UP POSITIONS AT KMS 27 AND 28, PROBABLY ON ROUTE 914. THE 3D COMPANY'S POSITIONS WERE LOCATED AT KMS 21 AND 23, PROBABLY ON ROUTE 914. THESE PRESENT LOCATIONS REPRESENT NO SUBSTANTIAL CHANGE FROM PREVIOUSLY REPORTED AAA POSITIONS OF THE 12TH BATTALION. 4. FURTHER REFLECTIONS OF LAM SOM 720 WERE NOTED ON 6 AND 7 MAY IN COMMUNICATIONS EMANATING FROM BT 41 AND BT 42. ON 6 MAY, THE 5TH INFANTRY COMPANY, BT 41 REVEALED THAT THE 4TH ARTILLERY BATTALION HAD DEPLOYED NEAR DONG CON TIEN AT YD 4303 (16-16N 107-16E). THE ARVN 2D AND 3D BATTALIONS AND AN AMERICAN SUPPORT BATTALION WERE REPORTEDLY PREPARING TO LAND POSSIBLY NEAR CA LUNG. THE FOLLOWING DAY, BT 42 REPORTED THAT THE 5TH BATTALION, ARVN 369TH BRIGADE HAD LANDED AT CAP NHUAN (UNLOCATED) AT 0700 G. BT 42 ALSO REVEALED THAT THE \$ENEMY\$ HAD PLANNED TO LAND THE 1ST AND 4TH BATTALIONS, ARVN 54TH REGIMENT AT KHE LAO (UNLOCATED) BUT HAD BEEN UNABLE TO DO SO BECAUSE OF BAD WEATHER. AS A RESULT, THE ENEMY WAS ATTEMPTING TO BRING IN THESE UNITS TO KHE LAO AND HP 1078 (YD 1030, 16-20N 107-11E) BY VEHICLE. IN ADDITION, BT 42 NOTED THAT OPERATION LAM SOM 720 WAS ENTERING PHASE TWO. AMERICANS WERE REPORTED TO BE NUMEROUS, BUT VERY CAUTIOUS. AFTER LANDING THEY CONSTRUCTED A NUMBER OF POSITIONS BEFORE ADVANCING. BT 42 NOTED THAT AMERICANS WERE ONLY BUILDING FORTIFICATIONS, AND SPECULATED THAT THE HEAVY RAINS MIGHT HAVE AN ADVERSE AFFECT ON ALLIED ACTIONS. (2/F1/VCJ/T3245-71, 070658Z; T3246-71, 070727Z) 5. POSSIBLY BT 42 REPORTED AIRCRAFT SHOOTDOWNS ON 8 MAY. THE 11TH COMPANY, 36TH AAA BATTALION, SHOT DOWN AT LEAST TWO HELICOPTERS, ONE OF WHICH CRASHED AT BAN HANG, ABOUT A KILOMETER FROM THE COMPANY'S POSITION. \$ENEMY\$ F4'S AND HELICOPTERS THEN FIRED MARKER ROUNDS AND DROPPED DELAYED-ACTION BOMBS ON THE COMPANY'S POSITIONS, BUT APPARENTLY LITTLE DAMAGE RESULTED. THREE \$AMERICAN BODIES\$ WERE REPORTEDLY FOUND IN THE WRECKAGE OF ONE
