Thank you very much for your nice letter of 5 January 1955. We were happy to be able to have you as our guest at the Cosmos Club.

You flatter me by the kind words of welcome, by saying that everybody is looking forward to seeing me so soon again. I have delayed taking off on my visit for a little while, for several reasons. First, I was laid low by a bad case of influenza and am now only beginning to feel well again, although I still have the sniffles.
