1. This letter is written presuant to telphone conversation of 17 December 1952 betreen Kr. H. B. Stauffer of your office, and $L t$. Baker of this office, with respect to obtaining answers to certain questions raised by the Burear of the Budget relative to the recommendation made by the Department of the Arry on subjact bill. In that conversation two questions from the Bureau of Budget nemorandur were presented to you and are as followst
"1. Were goverment time and materials and the ald of other goverment employees used by the claimant in developing his inventions?
2. Although not directed to invent, vere the clainant's inventions idirectiy related to his Federal employment?:
3. A complete review of the files in this office dealing with the above subject fails to reveal complate answers to the noted questions. There is some ovidence bearing on question $\mathrm{Ho}_{\mathrm{o}}$. 2 ; however, your opinion, together with pertinent facts in support thereof, is desized.
4. Other quesitions ralsed by the Bureau of the Budget bear an the relationship of subject bill to lars resulting from other bills supported by the Department of Defense, answers to which may be found in files of this office.
5. Under the circumstances of this case, it will be apprem ciated if the desired report on the above quastions is furnished at the earliest practicable date.
