Dear Mr. Riley:

Thank you for your letter of 17 June. Your kind offer to select the converters M-209 for me from the stock held by the J. J. Glass Company is much appreciated. However, I would hardly expect you to do this for me and to take care of properly packing and shipping them without paying you something for your trouble.

I would like to have two of the machines, in good working condition. If I pay the cost of packing and shipping by parcel post or prepaid express (whichever is cheaper), would you accept a small fee for your trouble? In the hope that this will meet with your approval, I enclose herewith my check for \$25.00 to cover the cost of two machines and packing and shipping them prepaid. Whatever is left from the \$25.00 you keep as a small recompense for your trouble.

If one or two copies of the instruction manual are available, I'd appreciate having same, but I do not actually need them for operating purposes.

Incidentally, I would like to know about how many machines the Glass Company originally bought, when and where they purchased them, and how many they still have on hand. Do you suppose you could find out and let me know? I would appreciate having this information.
