Claims 1, 2, 3 and 10 are rejected as failing to define invention over the patent to Pierce. As regards claims 1 - 3, it is immaterial whether the signals are transmitted when the relays are in the same relative positions or in opposite positions.

Claims 1 - 3 are further rejected as indefinite in that the "receiver" is not operated into either of two positions but rather the relay armatures.

Claim 8 is rejected as fully met by the patents to Belin and Jenkins.

Claim 4 is rejected as indefinite for the same reasons as claims 1 - 3 are rejected.

Claims 5, 6, 7 and 9 at present appear to be allowable.
