Dear Mr. Papkin:

Unfortunately, this Agency did not receive your letter of 28 April 1948 and as a result we have been somewhat in the dark concerning your consideration of our letter of 16 April 1948 addressed to Western Union.

The Telegraph Signal Analyzer would appear to fulfill a need expressed by our Teletype Maintenance Branch; however, a trial of these devices would materially assist in determining their suitability for this particular requirement. A loan of two of these devices for a two month period is therefore requested in order to conduct a test to determine their suitability and applicability. The number of these devices that this Agency will require will be determined from the results of the above-mentioned test.

It is believed that a synchronous motor, 115 Volts AC, 50-60 Cycle, would best satisfy our needs.

We would appreciate any assistance you may offer in this matter.
