Memo for Mr. Friedman:

1. If the reasoning behind COMMENT 1 were to prevail, a similar query should logically be forthcoming on all Panel and Board members associated with firms.

2. No one in PERS seems to understand the intent or implications (or flexibility) of the "Conflicts of Interest" legislation.

3. Paragraph 3 of COMMENT 2 is inaccurate. A pertinent chronology:

(a) Gen'l Canine's letter of invitation to Panel (Telecom) membership - 3 Feb '54

(b) Miller's acceptance - 12 Feb '54

(c) Your acknowledgment - 23 Feb '54

(d) On or about April, I received a call from Warren Turner. R/D needed Miller in a big rush - on the strength of his Panel membership, could he get 30 a day? Affirmative answer in light of (a). Mr. Turner mentioned

possibility of a 90-day appointment for Miller, with the intention of using him every other Saturday.

(e) C/S's D/F - 9 April

(f) S/ASST received copy of (3 April) 90^{day} appointment of Miller - with no explanation - 14 April

(g) You called C/S's attention to situation - 14 April

(h) Subsequently I asked Mr. Turner for written brief of situation (so that our records would be complete) in light of 9 April C/S's D/F. I was told that "I may do so when I get time." Apparently he (Turner) hasn't had time.

4. Mr. Miller's 90-day appointment was not made in accordance with the C/S's memo of 9 April. This is a physical impossibility.
