
Indirect Contact with Marshall Library

An indirect contact was made with the Marshall Library through a NSA representative who visited the institution on or about 4-7 April 1983. On the day before Mr. Russell Fisher journeyed to the Library I asked him to query the Archivist about the availability of BGEN Carter Clarke's interview tapes which he completed with Forrest Pogue for the biography of General George Marshall.

Inasmuch as an oral history interview was scheduled with BGEN Clarke at a later date, it was believed that a review of these tapes could provide useful background information for the interview.

Upon his return Mr. Fisher informed me that he had discussed the request with the Archivist and was told by him that the Carter tapes were "too profane" and are not available for auditing.

The decision was accepted and no further action was taken.
