STATEMENT ON FRIEDMAN COLLECTION

The Marshall Foundation has been informed that a suit had been entered against NSA which involves papers in the Friedman Collection in the archives of the Marshall Library. (These papers originally belonged to the noted cryptographer, William Friedman, and have been on deposit in the Library for approximately 15 years.)

In view of the fact that the Foundation does not know the details of the case, and the matter is apparently sub judice, it feels that it should not comment on the case.

The Friedman collection consists of approximately 3,000 publications, 30,000 papers, cryptologic devices, and a number of personal artifacts. Well over 99% of the collection is available to researchers on an unrestricted basis. Less than 1/2% (29 publications and 55 pages of correspondence) have been given government classification of Confidential or Secret. These documents are therefore not available to general researchers. There are no other documents withheld from the public.
