In those reports, SIGINT analysts included information that identified USPs or US entities on occasions while pursuing foreign intelligence tasking. The majority of the US entities' names were those of Internet service providers in e-mail selectors. In SIGINT products, disseminations were found to be improper, and the reports were canceled as NSA/CSS analysts learned of USPs, US organizations, or US entities named without authorization. All data in the canceled reports was deleted as required, and the reports were not reissued or were reissued with proper minimization.
