""YURIJ's"[iii] light-hearted approach to the "GNOME[GNOM]"[iv] case does not inspire any [% group garbled] in his ability to cope with the task set him. Working jointly with him has shown that the case is in inexperienced and far from firm hands.

and the like. The unnatural closeness of the relations is bewildering everyone. In the COUNTRYSIDE)DEREVNYa][ix] by reason of his rude and tactless behaviour YuRLJ is meeting with almost universal hostility from the staff [KOLLEKTIV]. He systematically sets himself up in opposition to the "EDITOR[REDAKTOR]"[x], with whom at the present moment this is giving rise to frequent clashes that affect the whole staff. The EDITOR asked me to pass on to our leaders[RUKOVODSTVO] that if YuRLJ does not alter his line of conduct he will be forced to raise the question of having him sent away. I think that in the interests of our effairs YuRLJ should be warned to behave less irresponsibly."

Forwarding has been held up because of a two months' break in communications.
