USCIB: 23/66 Item not on Agenda for the Eighty-seventh (Special) Meeting of USCIB, held on 22 June 1953.

Subject: Allied (NATO) Communications Security.

The CHAIRMAN recalled that at the 86th (Special) Meeting of USCIB the members discussed the Allied (NATO) Communications Security problem. Certain decisions were reached, including one to the effect that the President and the Special Committee of the National Security Council should be apprised of the present state of the communications security and "leakage" problem and the recommendations of the Ad Hoc Committee Report.

For the information of members, the Chairman stated that he had had an opportunity to discuss the matter with the Secretary of State and with the Deputy Secretary of Defense, and had apprised them of the Allied (NATO) Communications Security problem. He explained that he had sent a Memorandum of Information to the two members of the Special Committee, which memorandum summarized the problem and indicated the current action of USCIB in the premises. The Chairman said that a copy of this Memorandum of Information would be forwarded to all USCIB members by the Executive Secretary.

The CHAIRMAN also stated that he had discussed the subject problem with the President.

DECISION: (22 June 1953) No action required at this time.
